Dear Friends:

The Circle of Service Foundation is proud to share with you a summary of our grantmaking activity for 2006. This has been another year of growth and partnerships. As in prior years, our funding is primarily focused in the following fields: Education, the Jewish Community, Social Services, Health and Technology. We are pleased that many of the agencies and programs we support cross over more than one of these focus areas.

There are many high-quality organizations throughout the Chicagoland area serving underprivileged individuals in underserved areas, and we realize the role that these agencies play in the lives of many individuals. We also appreciate that the resources these agencies provide are both vital and limited, and we are pleased the Circle of Service Foundation can be a helping partner in this endeavor.

We are continuing our multi-year efforts of improving public education by supporting charter schools and expanding after-school academic and enrichment programs. We also are continuing our long history of supporting Jewish agencies in metropolitan Chicago. We want to ensure long-lasting connections to our past; remembering the heritage of our ancestors is quite important to us. This year, we partnered with several agencies that are collaboratively connecting Jewish teens to the Jewish community during their adolescent and young-adult years.

We kicked off our 2007 grantmaking with a board retreat. We toured various neighborhoods in Chicago where some of our grantees are located and visited a few of our partnering organizations. Our staff and board members spend many hours each year reviewing grants, making site visits and becoming educated in the fields we fund. The insight and information we glean from these personal connections are invaluable. Both our staff and board members hope to visit many more of these agencies during the upcoming year.

In 2007, we will deepen our commitment to helping individuals and families help themselves. The statement -- "If you give a man a fish, you feed him for a day. If you teach him to fish, you feed him for a lifetime" -- embodies one of the missions we try to achieve in our grantmaking. Our foundation is focusing on supporting agencies who work with individuals to achieve more than just a job – to obtain training and employment with living wages and benefits to move them toward economic self-sufficiency.

“Nothing will be accomplished if all possible objections must be overcome” is a philosophy we are embracing as we move into 2007. As a foundation, we want to take thoughtful risks and be innovative in our funding decisions. We hope our grantees will incorporate this mindset as they strive to develop programs to best meet the needs of their clients.

We include our shared office staff in our grantmaking activities through a unique giving program. This program engages and educates all of those associated with the Foundation in the needs of our community and the Foundation’s role in philanthropy.

Our ongoing challenge grants motivate agencies to diversify and increase their non-governmental donor bases. Many organizations received challenge grants from the Circle of Service Foundation in 2006, and this will continue in 2007. We encourage grant recipients to actively seek first-time donors, increase contributions from current donors as well as renew funding from lapsed donors. Historically, our grantees rise to the challenge and meet or exceed their goals.

Along the same lines, our Foundation recognizes the importance of a strong board of directors for every non-profit organization. We believe the privilege of board membership must be coupled with the responsibility of financial support. We encourage every non-profit board member to contribute financially to the best of their ability in addition to their commitment of personal time and professional expertise.

2006 Grant Highlights

Chicago Symphony Orchestra

\$15,000



The Chicago Symphony Orchestra offers some of the most comprehensive education, community relations, and diversity programs of any U.S. orchestra.

This season, the Chicago Symphony Orchestra's education and community programs will engage nearly 100,000 Chicago area schoolchildren, teachers, families, young musicians and concert attendees through programs at Symphony Center, in Chicago Public Schools, and at numerous community locations throughout the Chicagoland area.

The Chicago Symphony Orchestra's education, community relations, and diversity initiatives include Community Partnership Programs, stationed at community centers throughout the city of Chicago; youth education concerts and programs at Orchestra Hall and in Chicago Public Schools; the Chicago Symphony Orchestra in performances designed for the whole family; learning opportunities for adults; and advanced-level training and performance opportunities for young musicians.

New Schools Chicago / Renaissance Schools Fund **\$300,000**



On June 24, 2004, Mayor Richard M. Daley, Chicago Public Schools CEO Arne Duncan and the Chicagoland business and civic communities announced a bold initiative, Renaissance 2010 ("Ren10"). Ren10 will transform the Chicago Public School system by creating 100 new public schools in underserved communities to provide all families with high-quality educational options.

The Renaissance Schools Fund is an independent organization that serves as the private partner in the fundraising, strategy and accountability for Renaissance 2010. Beginning with the Class of 2006, each new charter or contract school will receive a grant of \$25,000 from the Circle of Service Foundation to defray expenses related to "opening the doors to students." Over the next four years, we will fund up to 40 new schools. The Class of 2006 is shown below:

SOS Childrens Villages Illinois

\$15,000



SOS Children's Villages Illinois is a non-profit child welfare agency that builds Villages for children who are removed from their biological families due to neglect, abuse, abandonment or inability to care for them. Unlike traditional foster care, SOS reunites children with their siblings to live together with a trained SOS foster parent who provides care, stability and structure. The SOS Children's Village model allows vital

support services to be close proximity of the home and thereby improving our ability to help these children become self-reliant adults.

The Chicago Village is the first urban foster care village in the entire world. Located on what was an abandoned lot for more than 20 years, SOS now has 12 single family homes and four duplexes on the site. In addition, 24 moderate-income homes are among the SOS homes on the scattered site. In the near future, the Village will have a community center which will house a day-care, computer lab, therapy rooms and a plethora of other programs for the entire 17th ward community.

Birthright Israel Foundation

\$500,000



Taglit-birthright israel provides the gift of first time, peer group, educational trips to Israel for Jewish young adults ages 18 to 26. Taglit-birthright israel's founders created this program to send thousands of young Jewish adults from all over the world to Israel as a gift in order to diminish the growing division between Israel and Jewish communities around the world; to strengthen the sense of solidarity among world Jewry; and to strengthen participants' personal Jewish identity and connection to the

Jewish people.

The gift of the 10-day trip is being provided by partners: the people of Israel through the Government of Israel, North American Jewish Federations through the United Jewish Communities (UJC), and leading private philanthropists.

Taglit-birthright israel operates on a belief that it is every Jewish person's birthright to visit Israel. To date, 120,000 young adults from 51 countries have traveled to Israel for the first time on Taglit-birthright israel trips.

HealthReach



\$30,000

HealthReach offers primary health care for the medically uninsured of Lake County, IL. Using the “free clinic” model of care, the agency provides access to quality healthcare, including prescription medications, to all who qualify regardless of their ability to pay. HealthReach is effective in meeting the medical needs of the population because of an intensive community effort which enables them to provide free care by utilizing 20 local physicians, 6 registered nurses, one nurse practitioner, one physician’s assistant and clerical personnel who volunteer their service to staff the clinic. Services are offered at their clinics in Waukegan and Mundelein. Both clinics are bilingual and offer referrals to other agencies in the area.

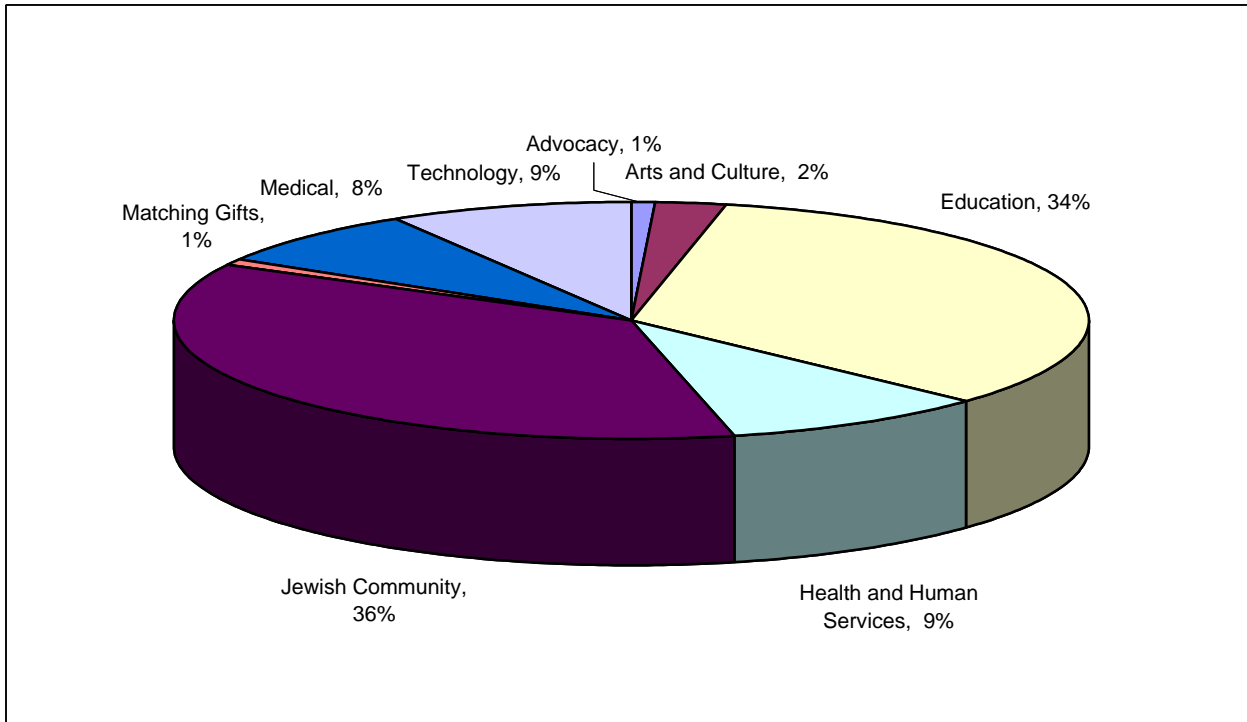
Lumity (formerly known as The IT Resource Center) \$32,500



Lumity, operating under its former name of IT Resource Center, has a twenty-three year history of training and advising nonprofits to use technology effectively, with a mission of technology leadership for nonprofit excellence. In 2006, they added financial and accounting advisory services. Their training and consulting services help organizations use technology to better fulfill their missions by improving operations, management, communications, and accountability to funders and the community. The Center works primarily in the six-county Chicago metropolitan region and is a model for other nonprofit technology assistance providers nationally.

In an increasingly digital society, technology is vital for individuals who want to improve their lives by accessing resources and opportunities. As a service provider to other nonprofits, they are now committed to helping organizations that use technology as part of their programming as well as for daily operations. In 2002 they began their first project to touch the individuals served by their nonprofit clients, as opposed to their typical focus on organizations. The Community Technology Center (CTC) Accelerator Project helps nonprofits overcome what is referred to as the Digital Divide: the disparity of opportunity created by a lack of access to technology in lower income communities. CTCs put computers and meaningful, appropriate training in disadvantaged neighborhoods, providing access, education, and encouragement for local residents. Community-based, they are responsive to the unique needs of each neighborhood.
